

ONTARIO PLACE REDEVELOPMENT TECHNICAL INFORMATION SESSION SUMMARY REPORT (DECEMBER 14, 2021)

Overview

On December 14, 2021, 141 people participated in a 90-minute virtual event to learn more about the site preparation, technical process and public consultation for the Ontario Place redevelopment project; and to ask questions to the technical project team. The public virtual event was hosted on Zoom Webinar. Participants were able to provide input through built-in polling features, chat and Q&A.

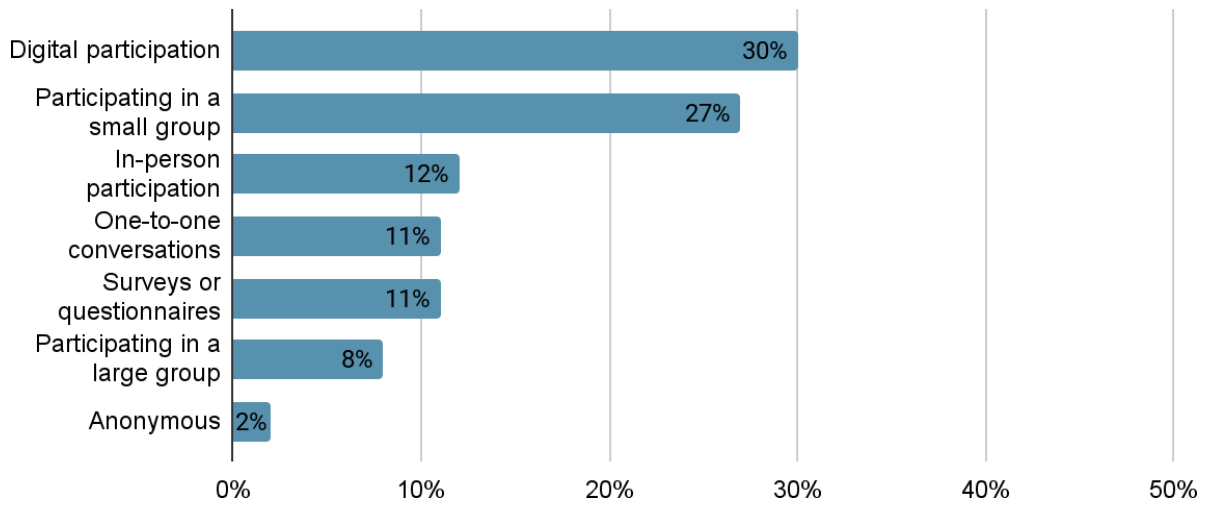
Summary of Question Themes

At the session, attendees asked questions on a range of themes. Among the questions received, common themes included:

1. Public access during development and construction
2. Environmental Assessment scope/timeline and public realm design (e.g., recreational trail, marina, public amenities, extent of public access)
3. Environment (e.g., wildlife) and heritage conservation and protection (e.g., cultural and heritage features)
4. Inclusive and transparent public consultation and reporting
5. Cost of the project and concerns with private development
6. Protection and conservation of natural heritage features (e.g., plants and wildlife), cultural heritage (e.g., Cinesphere and pods) and public art (including the Japanese Canadian Centennial Temple Bell)
