## ONTARIO PLACE REDEVELOPMENT TECHNICAL INFORMATION SESSION SUMMARY REPORT (DECEMBER 14, 2021)

## Overview

On December 14, 2021, 141 people participated in a 90-minute virtual event to learn more about the site preparation, technical process and public consultation for the Ontario Place redevelopment project; and to ask questions to the technical project team. The public virtual event was hosted on Zoom Webinar. Participants were able to provide input through built-in polling features, chat and Q&A.


## **Summary of Question Themes**

At the session, attendees asked questions on a range of themes. Among the questions received, common themes included:

- 1. Public access during development and construction
- 2. Environmental Assessment scope/timeline and public realm design (e.g., recreational trail, marina, public amenities, extent of public access)
- 3. Environment (e.g., wildlife) and heritage conservation and protection (e.g., cultural and heritage features)
- 4. Inclusive and transparent public consultation and reporting
- 5. Cost of the project and concerns with private development
- 6. Protection and conservation of natural heritage features (e.g., plants and wildlife), cultural heritage (e.g., Cinesphere and pods) and public art (including the Japanese Canadian Centennial Temple Bell)
